Bahamas: The sunrises on the island never cease to amaze!

NTM partners with Dona Banks who continues her work with Freedom to Read, Inc., an organization that refurbishes, remodels libraries up and down the island. Recently, Emily G. Petty Primary School, located in Governor's Harbour, Bahamas partnered with Freedom to Read, Inc. to establish a new library, which included a generous donation of books. Dona Banks worked with the school to replace current shelving, which was inadequate and unable to accommodate the expanding collection, with custom-built shelves. Additionally, a computer table was constructed to further enhance the learning environment. These improvements will significantly increase accessibility, providing students with greater opportunities to pursue their interests and foster a love of reading.

On her visit this summer, Dona worked mainly in a school library in Deep Creek, cataloging books so the library will be ready for student use.
